Sermon Reflections

Just Payback (Part 1) Exodus 22:1-20

Summary: A just God demands His people to do justly. Give people the good they are due.

1. Give back what is due (Exodus 22:1-17)

- God enshrines responsibility regarding personal property. Have you ever been responsible for the loss or damage of someone else's property? What was your reaction? Were you more concerned about your financial loss than biblical recompense? Were you perhaps too quick to accept a "it's ok, don't worry about it" from the lender? Read Matthew 6:24. Is it possible that you might be serving two masters?
- Read Matthew 6:33. Whose kingdom are we to be seeking *first* when we accidentally are at fault in these situations regarding other's property?
- God values life above all else as we see *specifically* in v.3: "but if the sun has risen...". What would be a modern-day example of this?
- What would your reaction be to a thief involving your personal property? Would God approve of your heart-motives? Would you be tempted to take irreversible actions while defending your personal property? What should your attitude be?
- Stealing, crime, SIN...it doesn't pay! Considering the sexual immorality on display in vv. 16-17, what thoughts come to mind regarding God's view of marriage? With the term "bride price" in view (v.16), why would the loss of a woman's virginity be considered such a grievous theft requiring justice?

2. Give God what is His due (Exodus 22:18-20)

- God does not tolerate competitors. What unrighteousness is described in vv. 18-20? When considering Romans 1:18-32, why is God's righteous anger so pronounced against this type of sin?
- Read Romans 1:24-25 and Exodus 32:2-4. What were these people worshiping and what is this called? Read Colossians 3:5-6. Why should we be concerned with God's hatred of idolatry?
- All that we are belongs to the Lord... Referring to our subject verses in Exodus 22:20; God demands sacrifices to Him... alone! What about the things in your own life that "compete" for your affections? Can competing interests & affections be a potential problem or a concern? Why or why not?
- Read Galations 2:20. Who lives in all believers? In sum, is there room in your heart for anything else?
